


Medium term: Provide stability by providing



# The New-Qala Concept


All distances in meters



- •Provides community, security, subsistence, identity and flexibility
- •Surrounded by an exterior wall with water standpipe in center
- •Houses up to 30 families

#### The New-Qala: Components


All distances in meters



#### **KEY**

- Initial wall
- Water pump
- Dwelling
- Animal place
- Inner courtyard central space
- •Central space for garden plots or general communal space
- •Central standpipe provides easy access to water


## Organizing the New-Qalas



- •New-Qalas are administered in groups of four
- •NGO provides assistance and organizes the settlement in a temporary building at center
- •Central flagpole indicates availability of plots!


## The Community Emerges

All distances in meters



- Four Qala courtyard provides space for neighborhood facilities
- "Market" areas provide cost-subsidy potential
- Trees encourage identity and definition

# The Eight Qala Block



- Block courtyard
- •Eight 4-qala units comprise a city block of 3800 people
- •The block is surrounded by major streets
- •Central space used for schools, parks, clinics, etc.

### Summary

- New-Qalas build upon Afghan traditions
- Qalas offer immediate support and assistance to returnees and displaced families
- Design adaptable to different needs
- Families retain control over their own homes. Responsibility remains within community
- New Qalas provide cost effective development structure (240 m/Ha land development index)
